



HOW TO SPOT XYLELLA IN YOUR ORCHARD

Stunting of shoots that can be greener and denser than normal. Lateral branches grow horizontally or drop, producing compact-looking trees. Leaves and flowers appear early in the season and leaves remain on the tree longer than on healthy trees. Affected trees show reduced yield with lower-quality fruit that are drastically smaller than average. The tree will usually stop producing fruit after three years.
